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Interrogative pronouns as verb bases in Evenki

Abstract

The paper considers the problems related to the part-of-speech homonymy based on the data of interrogative pronouns and verbs. Questions consisting of the interrogative verb $\bar{\delta}$ 'to do what' are identified; their use is described. Such a question is classified as rhetorical or non-intruisive question (when the answer is irrelevant in the current situation). Also, traditional and formal approaches to the problem of part-of-speech homonymy are viewed; the incorporation mechanism is considered in detail. The results indicate that incorporation along with conversion and word-formation are conceptually less adequate than A. Marantz's theory of roots¹ that are categorically undifferentiated. This is because incorporation assumes that the noun base is primary, whereas the verb base is secondary. At the same time, certain facts of word-formation and use of the verb $\bar{\delta}$ can be accounted for by incorporation. Other shortcomings of the incorporation theory applied to the current data are discussed.
